RESEARCH

COMMUNITY SERVICES

We offer training and technical assistance services to persons with disabilities and their families, community members, and to professionals in fields ranging from business to health care.

CONSUMER ADVISORY COUNCIL

Our work is supported through the contribution of our Consumer Advisory Council (CAC). The CAC is composed of individuals with developmental disabilities and related disabilities; family members of individuals with developmental disabilities; representatives from disability-related training, service, and advocacy organizations; representatives from state agencies; and other disabilities advocates. Meetings of the CAC are held four times a year.
